




Blue Jacket's goal is to create transitional positions at the business professional men's and women's thrift clothing venture, which opened a second location this year in July, using only Blue Jacket graduates. These transitional placements provide income, experience, and a leg up for people that possess little hope at becoming employed.

obbianne Anderson came across Blue Jacket's services by chance back in 2015, listed among a long list of resources provided to her and her boyfriend, Coyle, from a local church. After using the rest of their car's gas on the drive to Blue Jacket's orientation, they were almost turned away because the session had ended. As it turns out. sometimes chance takes you right where you need to be.

After graduation, Bobbianne volunteered in many roles, mostly surrounding the Blue Jacket Clothing Co. venture. "I think the whole time (Blue Jacket employees) were thinking they

were asking too much of me, and really they were saving my life," said Anderson.

"I feel like everything that I needed to work on, this was my safe place to get comfortable with it. This program took me in and took me under their wings, gave me room to grow, all the while believing in me and knowing that I could do it even if I didn't know it myself."

"Bobbianne is an enormous support to our clothing store staff. She does an incredible job with customers and training transitional employees," said store manager Angie Hallam. "I consider myself very blessed to have such a great partner for the clothing store and look forward to all of the growth in the future."

"They were there while I was learning my values, they were there while I was learning my boundaries," said Anderson. "In showing me that I do have strength, I do have power. I am bold and I'm dynamic and I can work a full-time job . . . For me, if it wasn't for Blue Jacket, I wouldn't be at the point that I am right now.
